Seniors College is a non-profit school, closely affiliated with U.P.E.I, and devoted to providing learning opportunities for Seniors (over fifty years of age) on Prince Edward Island. Courses range from Astronomy to computer basics to Irish Literature to Island history.

During the last academic year, Seniors College ran a very successful research course in which a number of professors from UPEI shared their research. This *Sharing Our Research* course is being offered again during the winter of 2014.

The course provides an opportunity for professors at UPEI, from numerous faculties, to share some of their exciting research. This is an excellent opportunity for members of Seniors College to connect with UPEI faculty members in a setting that allows learning to take place as well as fostering stronger connections between the community and the university.

The course will be held on the campus of Maritime Christian College (right across the road from the UPEI campus), Friday mornings from 9:30-12:00, for eight weeks (January 3- February 21).

We are looking for lively presentations on topics of interest to our well-informed and intelligent students. Each Friday would see 1 or 2 professors sharing the results of their research, with a break in the middle. The length of your presentation would then be either about an hour or two hours.

The following are examples of topics covered last year:

- Research in Early Child Development in Prince Edward Island
- **→** Research on Aging
- ► Emerging Technologies in Microscopy Improving Human Health One Slide at a Time
- **→** Microfinance in South Africa
- ► John Bunyan's Pilgrim's Progress and Early Children's Literature

If you have a topic that you think would appeal to this group please submit a brief proposal with the following information: title of your talk; a short summary of the topic; a brief statement on your teaching methodology (lecture, power-point, interactive, etc); whether there are any Fridays you cannot make it; and the best time slot for you.

Last year course was a great success. We had very positive feedback from the seniors who took the course.
