The MacLauchlan Prizes for Effective Writing

DESCRIPTION

The family of Harry and Marjorie MacLauchlan have a remarkable history of giving to the University of prince Edward Island. Their gifts have supported a variety of areas of need and have been significant to the development and growth of UPEI, its physical plant and its students. Their most recent gift is to create a major program of awards for student-writing achievement and to recognize the importance of effective writing as a foundational skill for academic success and lifelong learning. The MacLauchlan Prizes for Effective Writing will be the largest such student-oriented program in Canada.

CRITERIA

Beginning in the 2012-13 academic year up to eleven (11) prizes will be available for returning UPEI undergraduate students who during the previous September 1st to August 31st period, have demonstrated writing excellence in a forum outside of a university course and to a broader community-oriented audience. Students are eligible to win only one prize per year, but can be considered in subsequent years, as long as a new written piece is submitted.
