# Mosaics of Possibilities: Researching and Teaching through the Arts in Early Childhood Education

Artistic expressions, like story-telling, music, drama, dance and visual arts—are commonplace within early childhood education. For educators, the arts provide a window to a child's inner canvas, while children engage with the arts as a medium of expression, creativity, and emotional and social connection to the world around them (Fraser, 2012). Additionally, the arts contribute to the 'mosaic' of methodological tools (Clark & Moss, 2011) that support visual, participatory methods in conducting research with and alongside children. Please join scholars, researchers, and practitioners for an informative and engaging day of presentations, networking, and critical dialogue on the role of the arts in early childhood education.

#### **Post-Conference Format**

Based on the number of accepted submissions, we envision our day beginning with a short welcome and keynote presentation. Throughout the remainder of the day, several multi-paper sessions will be available for attendees to choose. Each multi-paper session will be 75 minutes in length where (up to) three groups of varied scholars and researchers will provide an overview of their individual focus of scholarship and help to contribute to the critical discourse related to the theme of the conference, *Mosaics of Possibilities: Researching and Teaching through the Arts in Early Childhood Education.* Each presenter (or presenter group) should allow for a 20-minute presentation and 5-minute question & answer period. Presentations may be in French or English. Three nutrition breaks planned throughout the day will afford delegates ample opportunity to interact as well as visit the poster sessions that will be presented and on display. A brief closing session will round out the day.

- Methodology (if research based)
- Findings/Implications/Future Directions

Please **clearly** indicate which of the following best describes your submission:

- Individual submission
- Self-organized multi-paper session of (up to) 3 distinct presentation groups
- Poster submission

Please also include a **short bio** for the first author of the submission.
